THIS WEEK . . . CAMPUS MINISTRY

The start of the fall semester is quickly approaching. Classes will begin August 15, 2010. This means that we will begin seeing that population explosion that goes along with this event beginning as early as this next week. For Flint Hills Christian Church this will mean the return of many familiar faces – students that had returned home for the summer – and the possibility of the appearance of many new faces – newly arriving students looking for a good church family during their tenure at ESU.

Both of these groups present an excellent opportunity for all the members of our church family to practice that most essential calling of our Christian lives – that is the role of discipling. God has called each of us to be active disciplers for the cause of the Gospel of Jesus Christ in people's lives. What does this work look like? Well, for one, it is extending a warm welcome (back), and for another, it is to offer frequent encouragement, both in terms of their school activities and in terms of their Christian life. The latter might be to ask them to join the college/young adults Sunday School class or to see if they might have an interest in getting involved in the ministries of the church. For my part, I hope to get them interested in visiting and being a part of the INNER BEAN ministry. All in all, it means investing the time to be involved in their lives to the degree that we are truly being brothers and sisters in Christ.

Many of our volunteers come from this visitation, as well as it being a tremendous opportunity to disciple this huge mission field.

The other event is the Faith Fair hosted by ESU to introduce the students to all the churches (all faiths) in and around the Emporia. This offers the opportunity for both the church and the INNER BEAN to be exposed to the larger population of the student body.

Lastly we are pleased that several members of our body have showed an interest in being involved with the workings of the INNER BEAN. Thanks to Jeff and Wendy Devilbiss and Cathy Autry for joining Peter Hauff, Joy and myself, as well as Molly Duncan (XENOS President), Zack Day (XENOS vice president) and Katie Duncan (XENOS secretary) and all our XENOS student volunteers. Our continued prayer is that God will use the INNER BEAN as a rich and productive field for the fruitful work of discipleship by both Christian students and those from our own body at Flint Hills to further the work of the Gospel to the campus of ESU and the city of Emporia.
